Adult Softball Leagues Forming

The Winthrop Harbor Recreation Department is pleased to announce that this year's registration for adult softball leagues begin on **July 9th**. Registration will be open through **August 10th**, however players are encouraged to register their teams as soon as possible before the leagues fill up! (A maximum of eight teams will be allowed in each of the two leagues (Men's and Co-Ed).

League fees are \$375 per team, with a one-time fee of \$10 for players who are not Winthrop Harbor residents. Teams will play one night a week for 7 weeks, if the maximum number of teams are filled.

The Men's Adult Softball League will play Tuesday and Thursday nights beginning August 21st, through October 18th.

The Co-Ed Adult Softball League will play Monday and Wednesday nights beginning August 20th, through October 17th.

ComEd Rate Relief and Assistance Initiative

Helping Customers Transition to New Rates

ComEd is reminding customers to apply for help with summer electric bills through their \$64 million Rate Relief and Assistance Initiative. ComEd already has granted more than \$15.4 million in bill credits to about 350,000 customers, and nearly \$30 million remains available to eligible customers this year.

Rate relief grants, credits and other programs are available now to customers most in need. For most programs, customers with incomes up to 200 percent of the poverty level, or \$40,000 for a family of four, qualify. In addition, a residential special hardship fund is open to families with incomes up to 400 percent of the poverty level, or \$80,000 for a family of four. Enrollment is now open, and ComEd encourages all customers who think that they may be eligible to apply.

Next Branch Pick-Up in October

Residents are reminded that there will be no branch pick-ups in July, August or September. The Winthrop Harbor Branch Pick-Up Program, which is intended for residents who prune their own trees, was revised for 2007. As tree maintenance is generally performed in early Spring or late Autumn, the pick-up service occurs on Mondays in **April & October only**. Please mark your calendars for the next dates that the Public Works Dept. will be picking up pruned branches: **October 1, 8, 15, 22 and 29**.

On these dates the Public Works Dept. will only be collecting trimmed branches. **Branches that are left from entire tree removals will not be picked up.** In addition, Public Works will not pick up lawn refuse, leaves, grass clippings, tree trunks and/or logs, etceteras. To facilitate timely pick-ups, the length of the limbs and branches should be left as long as possible. Whole limbs chip up much better than small, cut up pieces. Please spread out evenly along the parkway, with cut ends of branches and limbs facing the street. **Tangled piles of limbs or branches placed haphazardly will not be picked up.** If a tree trimming service or lawn service takes down, trims or prunes your tree, please have the service company provide removal of the

PACE DIAL-A-RIDE SERVICE

Pace Dial-A-Ride bus service is available for Benton Township residents. Service hours are Tuesday and Thursday from 8:30am until 4pm.

This service will take you anywhere in Benton, Newport and Zion Townships, as well as the Villages of Beach Park, Wadsworth, Winthrop Harbor, Gurnee and Zion.

Cost is \$1.60 one-way for adults; 80 cents for seniors and children ages 7-11. To schedule a ride, call 800-201-6446 at least one day in advance.

REDUCED RTA FARES

Reduced fares for RTA Metra trains and buses are available to seniors 65 and older. A photo ID is required. Please call to schedule an appointment.

PRESCRIPTION DRUG CARDS

For those without prescription insurance, Prescription Discount Cards are available at the township office.

Average savings at a participating retail pharmacy is 20% and the card may be used over and over.

Income or age is not a factor in obtaining the discount card.

FREE EMERGENCY CELL PHONES

For seniors and disabled citizens without a cell phone, the township office has free emergency cell phones available.

The phones are programmed for calling 911 only. Residents who have an old cell phone to donate, please bring them to the Township office.

HALF FARE TAXI PROGRAMS

Seniors 65 and older, and disabled residents of any age, may apply for half-fare rates on taxi rides. (Max. \$3) Please apply at the Township office.

MISC. SERVICES AT THE TOWNSHIP OFFICE

Need a document notarized? Could you use a new Illinois State Highway map? These and other services are always available at the Benton Township Office.

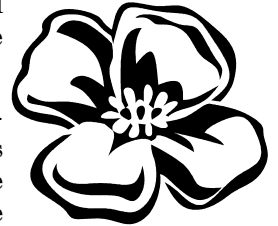
Thanks to the Village officials who allowed us the use of the 9th Street & Sheridan Rd. intersection for our fundraiser.

debris. The Public Works Department will not remove debris or branches left by tree trimming companies or lawn service contractors.

Please note that small amounts of branches or twigs that can fit into lawn refuse bags should be placed into bags instead of in the parkway. These smaller piles of twigs do not go through the chipper well.

You Drink, You Drive, You Lose!

The Winthrop Harbor Police Department reminds drivers that operating any type of motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol or drugs can lead to tragic results.

In 2005 there were 421,522 traffic crashes in Illinois, an average of 1,155 crashes per day. An average of 4 people per day were killed in these crashes, while 14 people per *hour* were injured. In Lake County, 19,124 crashes occurred, an average of over 52 per day. Sixty people died in Lake County crashes during 2005, with another 5,722 being injured.

Too many of these injuries and fatalities involve drivers who are under the influence of alcohol or drugs. Please drive responsibly, and use designated drivers or public transportation whenever necessary. Let's work together in preventing these traffic related tragedies!

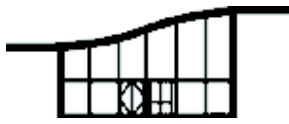
